Highlights of 'GPS 100' – A Year of Celebration

The GPS 100 Year began with a launch event in February at St Joseph's Nudgee College.

The event brought together 150 past and present students, staff and guests from each of the nine GPS Member Schools for an afternoon of celebration to reflect upon the best of GPS.

Magnificent GPS Centenary banners were presented to each GPS school at the launch. They were designed to recognise and celebrate the passion and loyalty of GPS supporters who inspire competitors to do their very best. The Centenary banners reinforce 100 years of tradition and friendly rivalry between the nine GPS schools, and now provide a focus for processions and presentations in all GPS Championship Sports and major Activities.

Young Australian of the Year, Nicholas Marchesi (GT 2011) along with David Tubb (GT 2010) spoke about the power of opportunity, reflecting on their services to the homeless with their 'Orange Sky' mobile laundry and showers. International cricketer and Queensland's all-time leading wicket-taker, Michael Kasprowicz, (BSHS 1989) spoke about taking ownership of your own destiny.

Centenary Rounds were also held at Member Schools with teardrop banners displayed, the movie trailer being played on plasma screens in some schools, and after match Old Boys events taking place. GPS 100 logos were worn on all Firsts uniforms adding to the Centenary feel.

GPS Music Showcase

The GPS Centenary Music Showcase followed hot on the heels of the launch in February.

The largest and most ambitious GPS music extravaganza ever delighted students and audience with a truly magnificent performance at the Queensland Performing Arts Centre.

His Excellency the Honourable Paul de Jersey AC, Governor of Queensland joined parents, friends and VIPs at the magnificent Centenary celebration.

For the first time social media was used in a coordinated way across all GPS schools to invite people to apply for tickets. Ticket reservations were made online for the first time too.

Record-breaking crowds of over one thousand guests enjoyed the four hundred and fifty exceptional student musicians in Concert Band ensemble, Symphony Orchestra and Choir.

Many schools also did full page spreads in their magazines which went out to GPS communities across the world. The Courier Mail and Quest Newspapers gave extensive coverage to the GPS 100 Rugby Premiership and the GPS 100 Track and Field Championships.

During the 2018 GPS 100 Rugby season, serious spinal injuries were experienced by four boys. In response to this, a Working Group was established to ensure changes are made that improve GPS Rugby player safety and care.
